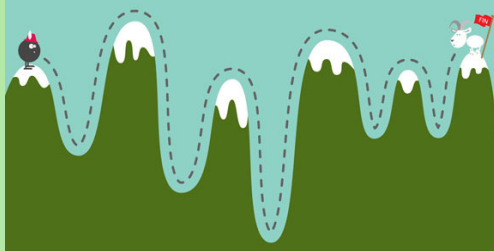

CLASS 4

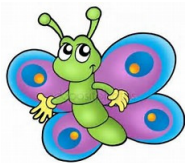
Super sorting and classifying of 3D shapes!
